The only exception to this is if decorations, lights, tinsel, etc. are left on the tree and/or if the tree is flocked (decorated with artificial snow). This means the tree needs to be placed out for trash on your trash day.



Final Chapter Of Improvements In Pennsauken Public Schools

As we approach the end of 2021, we have a lot of accomplishments to be proud of so far this year, we would like focus on the last chapter of improvements for our school district. This final chapter of improvements, which the public will decide on during the referendum vote on December 14,2021, will complete Pennsauken Public Schools and separate it from other school districts in overall academic offerings, athletic/extracurricular opportunities, and facilities usage.

The following highlights the proposed improvements targeted by the 2021 bond referendum.

Baldwin School

- Four new Pre-K classrooms
- State-of-the-art gymnasium
- Building roof replacement, along with chiller

Phifer Middle School

- Air conditioning throughout the entire building
- Parking lot expansion
- New bus loop and concrete walkway
- Multi-sport outdoor field with score-
- boards and exercise area

Pennsauken High School

- Magnet high school with physical and biological science labs
- · Second full-size, varsity, multi-sport

- athletic turf field
- Wrestling room and multi-purpose gymnasium for all students
- Eight-lane competition swimming pool/natatorium
- Outdoor courtyard/dining area
- Baking classroom in partnership with Puratos Corporation

With these proposed improvements, Pennsauken Public Schools will be able to create a direct kindergarten through 12th grade pathway for our students in our gifted and talented programs; develop a unique baking program with Puratos Corporation, the only one of its kind in the United States; provide a variety of additional academic and athletic opportunities for all of our students; and create elite facilities that benefit the Pennsauken community as a whole.

It is our hope that a student would be able to say they are in culinary arts, joined the marching band, and is a competitive high school swimmer. If a student wants to play ice hockey, be on the crew team, and/or join the swim team, while welding and being in our magnet high school division, all those things will be possible in our school district. If there is a ves vote by our residents on December 14.2021, all this will be possible in Pennsauken Public Schools.


We are growing and our enrollment numbers will not dictate the opportunities that we can offer to our students. These changes ensure that no matter how much our enrollment expands, every child will receive sufficient opportunity in academics, athletics, and vocational careers.

There is a minimal tax impact for this final referendum. Question one is a \$1.66 a week increase, and Ouestion 2 is a \$1.15 a week; for \$11.04 a month, all these changes will be possible and Pennsauken Public Schools will be complete.

For years, Pennsauken Public Schools had a declining enrollment, and the reputation of our schools was not in a positive light. Our past administrators felt that positive changes were not part of their job description. In five years, our current administration and Board of Education have invested \$52,000,000 in the district and added countless academic.vocational. and athletic programs. Please help us to complete the district and offer opportunities to our children that are numerous and enable their potential to be limitless.

Hoping for the collar of a coat, the officer instead grabs a fistful of air, as my father sprints for

davlight and freedom.

The reason I get a kick out of this story is that my father is the most responsible, stand-up person I know. I cannot picture this man, a highly intelligent mechanical engineer and project manager who dealt with admirals in the U.S. Navy during his career, doing something this crazy. In a way, it's refreshing. We're all human. We've all done things that when we look back at it, we marvel about how we didn't get seriously injured, arrested, or worse, caught by our parents. Plus, notwithstanding the acci-





HEALTHYLIFESTYLES Managing Complications Of Lupus

(Family Features) Many people may recognize the term "lupus" and think of it as an autoimmune disease that can cause joint pain and swelling, but you may not be aware lupus impacts an estimated 1.5 million Americans and can affect many parts of the body.

The disease that causes the immune system to attack its own tissues mainly impacts women, who make up 9 out of 10 lupus patients. Genetics also play a role in lupus; if you have a family mem-

ber with lupus or another autoimmune disease, you are at greater risk.

Some racial and ethnic groups are also at elevated risk, including those of Black, Asian American, Hispanic/Latino, Native American and Pacific Islander heritage. Additionally, Black, Hispanic/Latino and Asian American lupus patients are more likely to develop complications, including kidney damage, also known as lupus nephritis, and these patients tend to have worse outcomes than white patients Lupus nephritis – kidney swelling and irritation caused by lupus – affects up to 60 percent of patients with lupus, according to the American Kidney Fund. It can cause permanent kidney damage, called chronic kidney disease, which can affect your quality of life. People with lupus nephritis also have a higher chance of heart problems, blood vessel problems and developing certain types of cancer. Symptoms of lupus nephritis include weight gain, fatigue, joint pain or swelling, muscle pain, fever, high blood pressure and frequent urination. Because some of the symptoms of lupus nephritis can also look like symptoms of other diseases, it's important for lupus patients to talk to their doctors about testing their kidney function regularly. Testing your kidney function involves a urine test to look for protein and a blood test to check for *continued on page 26*

Pennsauken's Loaves And Fishes Food Pantry Recognized By Camden Diocese

The Pennsauken-based Loaves and Fishes Food Pantry, run out of Mary Queen of All Saints Parish on Camden Ave., has been recognized by the Diocese of Camden for its service to the community. In October, the volunteers' dedication to Catholic Ministry in South Jersey earned the pantry a Bishop's Medal: and last month. Loaves and Fishes' work with the poor and vulnerable was recognized by Catholic Charities' Disciples of Mercy Awards.

"I have such a wonderful group of volunteers who work with me," explained Mary McGinley, the longtime Pennsauken resident who has been coordinating the Loaves and Fishes Food Pantry for the past 20 years."The pantry wouldn't be here without them. They do it with a giving heart."

McGinley explained that the pantry averages about 45 families a week. The clientele consists mainly of the working poor, people who go paycheck to paycheck and just need a little extra help, particularly when something unexpected comes up.

"One bad week can be the difference from getting your car fixed or having a meal," said McGinley."When these people just can't make it, they come to us. Families can last three to four weeks on what we give them."

In addition to working with the Food Bank of South Jersey, volunteers collect food from both Aldi Food Store and Rastelli Market Fresh in Marlton, as well as the Target on Rt. 73 in Voorhees. They fill a van with approximately 1,500

pounds of food, including fresh produce, quality meats, pastries, bread, and specialty frozen foods. In addition, parishioners, as well as individuals who have "adopted" the pantry, fill baskets with personal donations. On Thursdays and Fridays, several different groups sort donated items, check expiration dates, and set up meat and dairy refrigerators. On Saturday mornings, the actual distribution begins, with additional volunteers handing out pre-packaged boxes of nonperishable food, along with meat and dairy items. From stocking the shelves to handling the substantial amount of paperwork, the work of a few truly impacts so many in need.






Remembering Stephanie D'Angelico

Stephanie was the type of colleague you could call any time, day or night, with technology questions. During one of her several stints as Interim Director, she often had to field calls from our security
