#### **WAGSWORLD** When A Hall Of Famer Came To A Pennsauken Picnic

Back in 1960, we lived on 45th St., the last house on the dead end, next to Amon Heights Elementary School. That meant there was a huge lot in my front yard, perfect for young kids to hit baseballs, ride bikes, throw rocks, and generally hang out. The street, with only four houses, was hard packed dirt, until I went into the army in 1966. Some time while I was away, the Township covered it with oil and chipped macadam.

But in 1960, on a hot summer's day, we had a weekend family weenie roast with family, friends, and a special surprise guest. Along with our extended family of 20 or so folks, Aunt Helen and Uncle Len were there. Uncle Len was mom's baby brother; and Aunt Helen, the nurse, was his young bride. Her mom, Aunt Ethel, was there also. Ethel Githens was a nurse too, and a very attractive widow. Her husband had died not long after the war, and we only knew about him from family stories. This day became an addition to those tales.

During World War II, Harry Githens was stationed in Germany with an engineering company. His buddy and bunkmate for a time was a young kid from New York named Warren Spahn, a pitcher for the Boston Braves. They served together for a few years; and when the war was over, both Harry Githens and Aunt Ethel stood for Spahn and his young wife at their wedding. That was all we kids knew of the story. There were a few signed baseballs around to make the stories sound right, but we kids didn't much care.

Back at the picnic, a good crowd was playing throw the ball around the school yard. Aunt Shirley was pitching. Shirley

was a tomboy and threw and hit better than most of the men in the family.

Somehow, unbeknownst to us youngsters, Warren Spahn had shown up at the house. He was in for a game against Philadelphia and had some time off to visit. He was on the front porch talking to Aunt Ethel and the rest of the family, reliving some of the good old days.

After a bit of visiting, he crossed the street and joined our ragtag bunch of voungsters. Someone threw him a glove. and he tossed a few pitches to the kids. Then Aunt Shirley came up, and he lobbed her an underhanded pitch. She made a face and challenged him to throw her a real pitch. He chucked a

Everyone hovered around for a bit, then the game broke up. The big folks stayed on the porch for a while talking, and the kids got more hotdogs and corn. Then he was gone.

Just another summer picnic. Lots of sweaty, running kids, probably a water fight. Pop Lee went to Parks Dairy for ice cream. No one got or asked for an autograph.



Writing about recent retirements in my department has occurred a half dozen times in my short tenure. It would be easy to simply type the number of years somebody worked somewhere, glossing over a career and not the effect of the work.

Take W. Scott Moses for example. Scott retired in late July after 29 years of service to the Township of Pennsauken. He began his employment on September 28, 1992, spending most of his time working out of the Police Station as the traffic maintenance worker before the Department of Public Works took this function over in March 2020. Scott was a one-man crew, performing a multitude of odd jobs over the years, but was mainly responsible for replacing and updating various traffic signs and street name signs around Pennsauken.

When I first met with Scott, I learned that one of the goals that he recently accomplished was the replacement of all "stop" signs in Pennsauken with the newer, more reflective materials. The sheer quantity of these signs boggles my mind! Together, we've updated some equipment to improve how we perform tasks, such as painting crosswalks and re-

striping municipal parking lots. He was a pleasure to work with, although we wish that he arrived sooner!

**Bid Process Open For New Trash And Recycling Collection Service** 

In early August, Township Committee decided to let the current three-year solid waste and recyclables collection contract expire on December 31, 2021, and not renew South Jersey Sanitation/Seaside Waste for the 2022 and 2023 option years. The Township has spent a sincere amount of time revamping the bid specifications in anticipation of this and formally advertised a notice of bid on Aug. 13 in the two legal newspapers.

Between then and mid-October, the Township will receive bids for trash/ recycling collection for the next three to five years. When the bids are opened at the scheduled "bid opening" on Oct. 13, all properly submitted bids will be compared in search of the lowest responsive/responsible bidder, per New Jersey state law.

We have included in this specification an option to transition our collection method from the manual throwing of cans/bags to automated/semi-automated collection, where all residents would receive a 96-gallon "cart" for trash and for recycling. With the manpower shortages experienced by trash collection companies affecting many municipalities this year, the ability to have one driver operate an "arm" to collect these carts would remove the need for two employee "throwers" on the back. You may recall earlier articles this year describing Department of Public Works employees working on the back of South Jersey Sanitation trucks.

Due to the age and design of the older sections of Pennsauken, some areas prohibit the automated truck's "arm" to deploy and grab the can, such as an alleyway or a road with heavy street parking. This is where "semi-automatic" service would be used that still requires a worker (or two) on the back of a truck but would allow all residents to have the same trash/recycling containers for a clean, uniformed look. In these instances, trucks would be outfitted with "cart flippers" that do the heavy lifting, sparing the employees on the back of the trucks the task of physically lifting each can/bag into

the truck. If you are curious about this collection method, visit YouTube and search for "automated trash collection." You will likely find a video of one of these trucks in action.

Cost, of course, will determine how the Township proceeds once all bids are evaluated. The actual contract award will occur after the bid opening by resolution at a Township Committee meeting. Before that happens, this evaluation will look into each bidder's submitted proposal, which includes their other current contracts, number of vehicles, and other metrics that we will use to determine if a particular bidder is capable of servicing Pennsauken properly.

#### Virtual Public Information Center Held For Multi-Use Trail Project

Last month, residents were invited to participate in a virtual public information center about the proposed Penn-

sauken-Merchantville Multi-Use Trail Project. The online presentation was designed to inform various stakeholders about the proposed plan of the project.

Dave Verdia, design engineer for Mc-Cormick Taylor, the design consultant selected by Pennsauken through the design assistance program with New Jersey Department of Transportation, explained that the multi-use trail was being undertaken through a transportation alternatives program (TAP) grant to extend the Merchantville trail into the Township.

"The grant was to extend the trail 0.3 miles east of Cove Rd., basically to the NJ Transit bridge," said Verdia. "The goals of this project are to promote and increase the use of non-motorized transportation; create a safe walking/bicycling environment; and repurpose vacant railroad property for recreation."

Included in the project is a 12-footwide paved multi-use path to accommodate bicyclists and pedestrians; rectangular rapid flashing beacons, also known as "pedestrian flashers," as well as push buttons; ADA curb ramps, crosswalks, and

pavement markings along Cove Rd.; decorative pedestrian-oriented lighting; and stormwater infiltration swales, long, gently sloping, landscaped depressions that collects and cleans stormwater. In addition, there will be a variety of linear park amenities, such as a sidewalk connection to Norwood Ave., shade trees and landscaping, rest areas with decorative benches, recycling and trash receptacles, pet waste stations, three-rail white vinyl fencing along the trail, and chain-link fencing along commercial properties.

Construction is estimated to take four to six months, dependent upon weather and site conditions. As the final design phase of the project is currently being completed, the work on the trail would begin in Summer of 2022.






In August, First Spanish Baptist Church had a special guest for morning services: New Jersey Governor Phil Murphy.

The Pennsauken Sewerage Authority is responsible for the operation and maintenance of the sanitary sewage collection system in our service area. The sanitary sewage collection system is made up of main lines, force mains and pumping stations.


The homeowner owns and therefore is responsible for the operation and maintenance of the lateral line from their dwelling up to and including the connection to the main line.

The rules and regulations of the Pennsauken Sewerage Authority require a

back flow prevention device commonly referred to as a "back check valve" be installed whenever plumbing fixtures are located below street level, such as in the basement. PSA strongly recommends all our customers have a back check valve installed to prevent contamination in the event of a main line stoppage.

The discharge of water collected in a sump pit to the sanitary sewage collection system is prohibited.

Cooking grease poured down the drain can cause a blockage of the lateral line. Please dispose of grease properly.



#### Think Twice About What You're Flushing

Baby wipes, disinfectant wipes, paper towels, and even "flushable" wipes, can't go down the toilet

Please do not flush baby wipes, "flushable" wipes, disinfectant wipes or paper towels down the toilet.

The Pennsauken Sewerage Authority is asking residents to think twice about

what they are flushing down their toilets.

Paper towels, tissues, napkins, disinfectant wipes, and supposedly "flushable" wipes should not be flushed down the toilet.

We are seeing an increase in volume,

which is to be expected given the number of people staying in their homes as part of efforts to prevent the spread of coronavirus.

remains available 24 hours a day to assist residents. We will respond to all requests for assistance and will advise the homeowner of our findings by telephone. If you require assistance call (856) 662-0686.

"We enjoy getting out meeting these folks and doing work for them," added







#### **MPWC Water Service Line Inventory**

As you may already be aware, New Jersey Assembly Bill 5343 requires all water systems to inventory and replace lead service lines. The majority of our service lines are copper. However, we are required to provide an accurate inventory of the various service line types on the customer owned portion of the service for our entire service area.

YOU CAN HELP by informing us of the type of water line coming into your

property. If you know what kind of pipes you have (copper, plastic, galvanized steel, lead, etc.) you can call our office and report the information to one of our Customer Support Reps. Use the photos and information included here to help you identify the type of service line at your property.

If you are unsure, you may schedule an appointment with a Service Technician, or you can snap a photo of the pipe coming into the property that connects to your water meter.

We thank you for your assistance, as we work to meet the state's deadline for confirming our system inventory and continuing to provide the best quality water possible.


#### **Identifying Your Water Service Line Type**

Recommended tools: flathead screw-driver, refrigerator magnet

- First, locate the water service pipe coming into the building (typically in the basement if your property has one). An "inlet valve" and the water
- meter are installed on the pipe after the point of entry.
- Next, identify a test area on the pipe between the point where it comes into the building and the inlet valve.
- If the pipe is covered or wrapped,

expose a small area of metal.

 Use the flat edge of a screwdriver or other tool to scratch through any corrosion that might have built up on the outside of the pipe.



LEAD PIPE If the scratched area is shiny and silver, your service line is lead. A magnet will not stick to a lead pipe.




COPPER PIPE
If the scratched area is copper in
color, like a penny, your service line
is copper. A magnet will not stick to
copper pipe.



GALVANIZED STEEL PIPE If the scratched area remains a dull gray, and a magnet will stick to the surface, your service line is galvanized steel.

#### In the GARDEN **Gardening As Summer Transitions To Fall**

Welcome back! As much as I love to see the beautiful summer flowers in the garden, all good things must come to an end. This summer seemed to go by way too fast. It is hard to believe that soon it will be fall with its much cooler weather.

The month of September does have many changes in temperature. It could be cooler then get hot again with one last heat wave before we enter a crisp fall. Now some plants enjoy the cooler temperatures and will continue to bloom for the whole month. I have found in my Pennsauken home geraniums and marigolds do well. As your annual plants die, you can pull them out of the ground and replant winter pansies (viola hiemalis) or chrysanthemums, mums for short. Both pansies and mums should not be planted until late September or early October. If you plant the mums too early, they will not be blooming for all of fall. I purchase them when they still have tight buds; that way you get most of the blooming cycle. Mums come in a variety of beautiful fall colors, such as yellow, orange, purple, white, and maroon. You could even add some hay bales, pumpkins, gourds, and corn stalks to your garden display. Pinch the mums back when they're done flowering and they can be relocated in the spring. Do this later in

May when there isn't a risk of more frost.

Winter pansies will tolerate the cold weather and stay blooming all fall, winter, and spring. They are my personal favorite since I love to see the flowers all vear round. Pansies come in shades of yellow, white, purple, and pink. They can be dead headed to produce more flowers and tolerate frost temperatures.

Fall is also a good time to plant shrubs and split established perennials. Be sure to water them once they are planted. Even though the temperature is cooler, water is necessary to keep them alive and growing. Also, you can plant spring bulbs for a pleasant surprise in the garden when the warmer weather returns next year.

Soon you will be enjoying some pumpkin spice treats as you sit outside enjoying the cooler nights, but for now, I am holding on to the last days of summer sipping my tea and watching the lighting bugs.







A blind test among fantasy football fans ranked eight frozen pizzas available at your local supermarket.

If you do frozen pizzas at home, it can be a tough decision on which pie to buy. Some companies get you with their tantalizing commercials promising ooey, gooey cheese and crispy, golden crust. Others lure you in with humor. In the frozen food section, you're faced with 10 or 20 different pizzas to choose from. How do you pick the right one? Well, my loyal readers, I have completed an utterly grueling task of buying, cooking, and tasting EIGHT different frozen pizza brands to help guide you on your next visit to the frozen pizza aisle. NOTE: This research was in no way grueling and absolutely delightful.

Heading to ShopRite, I bought Celeste Pizza, Tony's Cheese Pizza, Caulipower Margherita, Freschetta Kitchen Fresh Thin Crust Premium Pepperoni, DiGiorno Hand-Tossed Pepperoni, Red Baron Brick Oven Crust Cheese Trio, Bowl & Basket Rising

Crust Pepperoni Pizza, and Tree Tavern Cheese Pizza. Luckily, I was taking part in a fantasy football draft on the Sunday I had purchased the pizzas and decided to use all the people involved as my trial subject. They did not object. After cooking and slicing each pie, I designated them each a number and hid the names. This was a blind tasting, and I didn't want anyone to be swayed by a personal favorite. Twelve people tried the pizzas and rated them from best to worst. The results are as follows...

Coming in last place and with a \$.99 price tag per pizza was Celeste Pizza for One. This is a hit amongst young children, but for the adults, it was a huge let down. Most of the tasters know which pizza this was simply by its signature look and tiny size. The taste and texture are all around underwhelming to say the least. In seventh place at \$7.00 was the Freschetta Premium Pepperoni. Obviously, price isn't everything on this one. The crust was

unimpressive, and the toppings weren't very plentiful. Sixth place goes to the \$4.00 Tony's Cheese Pizza. This wasn't necessarily a bad pizza, but it definitely wasn't the best. Fifth place went to the DiGiorno Hand-Tossed Pepperoni Pizza. At \$7.00, it just hit the mark. It wasn't very saucy and was a bit too puffy and chewy, even though I cooked it an extra 2 minutes at the request of the group. In fourth place and to my pleasant surprise was the Caulipower Margherita Pizza. This one is a favorite of mine and is just \$5.00. The topping is well proportioned, and the tomato flavor is almost fresh tasting even for something frozen. Third place goes to Bowl & Basket Rising Crust Pepperoni. This pizza cost me \$4.50 and seemed like a steal for the decent flavor and textures. Second place was the Red Baron Brick Oven Crust Cheese Trio. The cheese on this pizza was great. The flavors were spot on and the price of only \$4.00 just at the package. This is definitely a go-to pie and it's available almost everywhere.

Number one gets its own paragraph for a few reasons. I had never heard of Tree Tavern Pizza. This company has been around for over 65 years, and I am only just discovering it. When I was cooking it, the smell was reminiscent of my days in grade school, when we got those rectangle pizzas served on Styrofoam trays. The taste, however, was that of a really good, homemade, no frills, pizza pie. It's the perfect pizza for a pizza purist who enjoys good old fashion sauce

and cheese on a darn good crust. What's more amazing is that Tree Tavern is named after a restaurant and tavern of the same name based right in Paterson, N.J.! Tree Tavern is owned by the Francia family, and their frozen pizzas hit the shelves of supermarkets in 1955. They were the first frozen pizzas ever sold! Their pizza is also preservative free. This essentially means that you can read every single ingredient on the package,

all of which are the basics for the perfect cheese pizza pie. It gets even better my fellow foodies: this pizza is only \$6.00.

I urge all my Food Adventures fans to give all of these pizzas a try for yourself. If you discover a new frozen pie I need to try, let me know on my Facebook page, "AAP Food Adventures." My hope is that you discover a gem like Tree Tavern, and of course always enjoy your Food Adventures.
