Pennsauken Township Police Officers Now Using Body Worn Cameras

On Monday, October 25,2021, the Pennsauken Police Department began implementing newly purchased body worn cameras. These cameras will be worn by all officers on the force.

"Every officer in this department, from the police on the streets up to the chief, will be issued a body worn camera," said Pennsauken Police Chief Phil Olivo. "This is a big step in enhancing transparency with the Pennsauken Township Police Department and the community. The body worn cameras will also enhance the capturing of evidence and statements of victims when our officers arrive on scene.

"The use of these important law enforcement tools is governed by policy that was developed based on guidance from the New Jersey Attorney General's Office, feedback from community stakeholders, and our officers. I would like to thank Mayor DiBattista, Deputy Mayor Rafeh, Township Committee, and Township Administration for funding this project."

"We are proud of the work and research conducted by Chief Olivo and the leadership team at the Pennsauken Police Department. This technology is a tool and the data will show the great work of Pennsauken Police Officers every day," added Fire Chief Joe Palumbo, who also serves as the town's director of public safety. "The archival information essentially documents every incident response

As part of Township Committee's initiative to enhance

our outdoor spaces, we commissioned a formal study to see how and when our parks are used by our residents. What we learned is that our Pennsauken Skate Park is the most frequently visited recreation area in our town. I remember talking

to my grandmom Ethel about the amazing changes she had seen in her lifetime. We had a lot of great talks over the years as I was growing up, starting in my elementary school days, and lasting into my early days as a dad. One such morning, over coffee and a piece of her apple pie, I asked her what change in life was the most amaz-

ing. By this time, she was in her early eighties.

Born before 1900, she lived in a time where there were more horses than cars and trucks. Refrigeration was a luxury. Medicine wasn't far improved since the Civil War. Now, in her later years, she could fly across the ocean in about the same time it took her, as a child, to travel to the Jersey shore.

She marveled at electricity as a youngster, and indoor plumbing with

water piped into the kitchen. Now she could watch a rocket land on the moon from her own living room. The changes in the world she lived in were amazing.

She said that, looking back, the changes seemed gradual. She noted and enjoyed most, if not all, of the added comforts and improvements we now take for granted. But with all the modernization and wonderful life changing events available, she claimed that her family, her friends, and her church were what she thought most about.

With as much change as has happened around her, she said the one constant was her bible. It was the same one she read as a little girl, before glasses or electric lights. It was the same one she helped read to children in Sunday school

or discussed with adults in bible study. It had not changed since her family and friends served in World War I, or sons and daughters in World War II and a son in Korea. And it gave her comfort to read while I, her oldest grandson, served in Viêt Nam.

Grandmom Ethel liked the fact that although the world continues to change every day, something like her faith, her church, and her bible stayed as solid as a rock. She always hoped, in her quiet and nonjudgmental way, that I would see the light that she saw in her good book. She never preached to me or at me. She even defended my mom and dad's church that told us small kids that ours was the only way and that poor Grandmom, bible study leader, and Sunday school

teacher, wouldn't be joining us in heaven. She told me not to overreact. Just live a quiet life, take care of your family and friends, and treat others as you would want to be treated. Maybe read that book a bit.

And then she was gone. I found her family bible not long ago while packing up mementos from Mom's house. It brought back a flood of good old memories, some great family stories, and a warm, fuzzy feeling that even my own old age infirmities cannot turn around.

I have seen many changes myself. But not as many as Grandmom Ethel Lee. To this day, I don't know what she thought was the most amazing change she saw. Personally, I think it was me!

For the past several months, Pennsauken Township has been updating ordinances and programs that focus on the care and upkeep of animals.

Addressing Potentially Dangerous Dogs

Last month, Township Committee introduced an ordinance to the municipal code that defines the conditions that would declare a dog kept in the Township as "potentially dangerous." The municipal court can declare a dog to be potentially dangerous if clear and convincing evidence is shown that the dog "caused bodily injury to a person during an unprovoked attack and poses a serious threat of serious bodily injury or death to a person;" or caused serious bodily injury or killed another domestic animal. Potentially dangerous dogs will have an annual licensing fee of \$700, and

their owner will be legally obligated to meet several requirements for owning the animal, including fitting the dog with a special red licensing tag; tattooing the registration number of the dog in a prominent location on the animal; displaying warning notification about the potentially dangerous dog on the property; and erecting and maintaining an enclosure for the dog to be kept.

This ordinance will have its second reading later this month at an upcoming Township Committee meeting.

Licensing Of Domesticated Cats

Beginning January 1, 2022, Pennsauken Township will require residents who own domesticated cats to obtain a license for their animals. The fees are identical to those for licensing dogs: \$12 for a spayed or neutered animal; \$15 for those cats that are not spayed or neutered. More details will be shared via



This article marks the beginning of leaf collection operations at Public Works.

By the time this article hits your mailbox, our crews will have begun the process of driving each street of town in search of piles of leaves. It is highly encouraged that you bag your leaves whenever possible. However, there are parts of town, where the density of large, mature

trees makes bagging your leaves prohibitive, requiring the Department of Public Work's collection efforts. The main reason we encourage residents to bag leaves is to protect our storm water inlets along our streets from becoming clogged, preventing the flow of water from the street into the storm water system. In addition to this, any fall breezes that come through won't blow that leaf pile back onto your lawn or all over the street! The bagged leaves that

are collected by South Jersey Sanitation on Wednesdays are taken to Smith Orchards for recycling. Each year, the Township compiles a tonnage report based off of the yard debris collected, similar to the white goods collected and our annual recycling collection; and receives credit towards our annual recycling grant.

You may not be aware of what happens to those mountains of leaves that the Department of Public Works collects. Our department operates and maintains one of the best functioning and best kept leaf composting sites in New Jersey. Each year, inspectors from the state and county comment on how great the site looks in comparison to others they visit. After the compost matures, it is delivered to the brick bin at the Municipal Pool parking lot on River Road, where residents can supplement their gardens at home with this nutritious soil. Although it is closed to the public, the compost facility is located on Park Ave., resting beside the Pennsauken Creek, before you cross into Maple Shade. Currently, you will view an open piece of land. Within the next month, you will begin to see the collected leaves being formed into rows, called "windrows" Once our facility is nearing its 10,000 cubic yard capacity, you'll notice the windrows are pointed in a specific direction. The windrow field is sloped downward to allow water to filter in a grass area and collect at a basin. This prevents "ponding" or stagnant water, which could breed mosquitos and an unpleasant odor.

Between the normal Wednesday yard debris collection of bagged leaves and the Department of Public Work's curbside collection, Pennsauken remains compliant with our compost site's permitted capacity, while clearing out 2021's fallen leaves. A few of you may have your own composting methods at home for the reuse of food scraps and yard debris. Although our facility only handles leaves, the process is very much the same, just on a much larger scale.

Leaf collection season runs until Dec. 31, so don't worry if you push this chore into December. Typically, the bulk of our annual efforts are completed by mid-December, with "spot collections" occurring the last two to three weeks of the year. Spot collections are only performed during this time.

Park Avenue Road Improvements

Camden County is continuing their restoration of roads in Pennsauken and the surrounding towns. Work along Park Ave., between Union Ave. and Cove Rd. will continue into December, weather

permitting. Per the most recent progress meeting, the stretch between Cove Rd. and the railroad crossing should be complete with final paving by the time this article hits your mailbox. On the stretch of Park between Union Ave. and the railroad crossing, there is significant storm water management infrastructure that is being installed on the west side of the roadway to alleviate the flooding in the area. This will get the rainwater down into the system instead of needing to run down the curb all the way to the creek next to the railroad crossing. You can already see the new concrete gutter and curb, along with new, ADA handicap ramps that are being installed, along with some driveway apron grading. Due to the time of year, the project will likely shut down during the winter and pick back up in the spring, mainly for paving. Final Chapter Of Improvements In Pennsauken Public Schools Is Approaching

The 2021-22 school year is in full swing. Our schools are full, and enrollment is the highest it has been in an over a decade. Pennsauken High School will see an enrollment of 1.600 students, which has not been that prominent in a very long time. The word is out, and students and families are returning to our great school district. This is thanks to all the residents that voted for our last bond referendum and overall district facilities improvements in 2018. Through the bond referendum and knowledgeable district budget usage, we were able to completely overhaul the school district through the improvement of athletics, academics, and career and technical education programs. Working together with the support of our Board of Education, Pennsauken Public Schools has built stateof-the-art athletic facilities, created a full day pre-kindergarten program, created new academic and vocational programs, and revamped buildings with security vestibules, needed door and window upgrades, and the creation of brand-new academic programs.

One example is Pennsauken Public Schools' Career and Technical Education (CTE) programs. All families interested in CTE options for students can choose from many vocational options, such as automotive, carpentry, cosmetology, culinary arts, electrical construction, welding, criminal justice, Air Force JROTC, HVACR, EMT and fire safety, and health occupations. Additionally, our dual credit courses at the high school level allow students to attain up to an associate degree (60 college credits) before they graduate high school. These programs did not exist five years ago and many of our students and families have already directly benefited from their existence.

The job of an administrator is not simply to make sure students graduate from high school. There is a responsibility to ensure that all students have a real future when they graduate and robust opportunities while they are in our schools. If a student in Pennsauken Public Schools does not want to go to college, it is the responsibility of the school district that they have a career option when they leave. But Pennsauken Public Schools are not comfortable with them simply getting a job. Moreover, it is also the responsibility of the administration to offer many options of extracurricular activities for students while they are in district. In five years, we have added free music lessons for students beginning in third grade, ensured opportunities in music and performing arts, began an ice hockey team, a crew team, an eSports team, and built two prominent weight rooms and athletic facilities that rival all others in our state, simply to name a few.

This final chapter of improvements, which the public will decide on December 14,2021, will complete Pennsauken Public Schools, and separate it from other school districts, in overall academic offerings, athletic/extracurricular opportunities, and facilities usage. We are building four more classrooms and a gymnasium at the Baldwin Early Childhood Learning Center, We are offering all of our families full day prek, which will have a direct impact on how students perform in high school. We all know that Phifer Middle School needs air conditioning; this upcoming referendum vote will not only utilize a full HVAC replacement, but also will change the overall air quality in the building. At Phifer there will also be parking lot repaying and expansion: the creation of a new bus loop and concrete walkway which will ensure that Park Avenue traffic will be smooth and comfortable. We would also like to upgrade Phifer Middle School's fields through new six-foot wide asphalt paving, new scoreboards, new exercise station areas, new fencing, and a new football field. Our goal is to be able to offer the usage of our facilities to the community at large, as we are a growing team. Pennsauken Public Schools will be there for our community.

Pennsauken High School will receive a great degree of upgrades as well, including a magnet high school facility for students that will be comprised of 10 classrooms and three laboratories for biological and physical sciences. This will create a direct K through 12 pathway for our students in gifted and talented programs throughout the district, along with students in our new Roosevelt K through 8 Science Technology, Engineering and Mathematics (STEM) Academy, which will open in September of 2022. Pennsauken High School will also benefit from a state-of-the-art wrestling room/gym expansion, as well as a brandnew baking CTE program, conducted in partnership with Puratos International Baking Company, along with an outdoor dining courtyard with vast student dining opportunities. This baking division will ensure student career opportunities that will spread throughout not only the country, but the globe, as Pennsauken will be the only Puratos Baking School in the United States. Additionally, we will be building our second turf field on the soccer field on Remington Ave. Lastly, it is our hope to build an eightlane competition 25-meter natatorium (competition swimming pool) with a lobby,

bathrooms, locker rooms, offices, and spectator seating. This would benefit our students and the Township, as there would be partnered community usage for Pennsauken residents. Students would take swimming throughout their academic careers, learn to swim early, and leave physical education class with lifeguard certifications. This would not only change the athletic dynamic of the school district but also ensure the students a full gamete of opportunities when they step foot on our campuses.

It is our hope that a student would be able to say they are in our culinary arts program, joined the marching band and is an elite high school swimmer. A second example is if a student wants to play ice hockey, be on the crew team, and/or join a swim team, all while welding and being in our magnet high school division, those things will be possible in our school district. If there is a yes vote by our residents on December 14, 2021, it will be possible in Pennsauken Public Schools.

We are growing and our enrollment numbers will not dictate the opportunities that we can offer to our students. These changes ensure that no matter how much our enrollment expands, every child will receive sufficient opportunity in academics, athletics, and career/vocational careers. There was a negative tax impact for the first referendum and minimal tax impact for this final referendum. Question one is a \$1.66 a week increase; and Question 2 is a \$1.15 a week increase. For \$11.04 a month,

all these changes will be complete and Pennsauken Public Schools will be complete. That's the truth regarding this vote. Please be wary of any misinformation that is put online or anywhere else. For years, Pennsauken Public Schools had a declining enrollment, and the reputation of our schools was not in a positive light. Administrators felt that positive changes were not part of their job description. In five years, our administration and Board of Education put \$52,000,000 into the district and added countless academic, vocational, and athletic programs. Please help us to complete the district and offer opportunities to our children that are numerous which enable their potential to limitless.

We would like to take this opportunity to thank our parents, students, teachers, administrators, bus drivers, secretaries, food service workers, teacher assistants, nonteaching assistants, custodians, maintenance workers, and every other staff member that went on this journey with us. Working closely with our Board of Education, we will continue to ensure Pennsauken Public Schools offer more opportunities than any other school district in the State of New Jersey. We cannot continue to thrive without our employees, parents, students, and community and we appreciate you.

Pennsauken Public Schools will continue doing our best for students to ensure learning opportunities and educational experiences in and out of the classroom. 

MPWC Infrastructure Project Update

Customers residing in Pennsauken on the 7200 and 7400 blocks of Walnut, Cedar, Githens, Rogers, Irving, and Harvey avenues, as well as the 2800,2900,3000,3100, and 3200 blocks of Finlaw Avenue, were informed that the MPWC would be conducting water main relining procedures on their streets. The work began in mid-October and will continue through Dec. 1.

Relining the water mains ensures that customers receive the best water quality, pressure, and flow. The relining process involves cleaning out any deposits in the water main, then installing a new liner inside of the main to keep any deposits from reforming.

All work will be conducted between the hours of 7:00 a.m. and 5:30 p.m. Contractors will be placing 2-inch temporary water lines down the sidewalks and installing temporary service lines to the outside hose spigots. During the project, brief shutoffs of water will occur (less than 1 hour).



In the GARDEN

Still Plenty To Do Outside As The Weather Cools

Fall – and all things pumpkin spice – is in full swing. There's nothing quite like the crunch of crisp leaves as you walk around your property. But they're not just pretty to look at and walk through. Leaves can be helpful for your gardens as free mulch and fertilizer. Place enough to cover the beds, but don't overdo it. The remaining leaves can be saved for compost, or bagged and left at the curb for yard waste pickup on Wednesdays.

Now is also a good time to pull those pesky weeds that are still hanging around. They're easier to find now that flowers and other plants have died back.

You can still water your grass, trees, shrubs, and flowers, like winter pansies, until we start hitting freezing temperatures. It's also the time of year to plant

spring-flowering bulbs like hyacinths, irises, daffodils, crocus, tulips, Spanish bluebells, and snowdrops. The rule of thumb is to dig a hole that is three times deeper that the height of the bulb you're planting.

And if you haven't done it already, all those garden decorations should be pulled up, cleaned off, and put away. Larger items, such as concrete birdbaths and metal lawn furniture, should be covered with tarps and tied off to get ready for the arrival of more wintery weather. Brrrr...

So even though the weather is cooler, there's still plenty to do outside to maintain your gardens for the winter months, while preparing for the spring.

a nominal fee. This program is currently in development; more details will be forthcoming from the Township's municipal government.

In addition, due to the overwhelming response by residents reporting stray cats to the community cat management program, there is currently a delay in responses by several weeks. This is a volunteer-run initiative; more residents are needed to participate as community cat caregivers, who assist in the trapping, sterilizing, vaccinating, ear-tipping, and returning of community cats to the area where they were first trapped.

The Pennsauken Sewerage Authority remains available 24 hours a day to assist residents. We will



Dressler explained that while listening to WFIL, a Philadelphia-based Christian radio station, there was an opportunity to be chosen as the subject of an "In Touch Magazine" article, which will be published this December.

"I answered a survey because I always listened to Dr. Stanley's messages because I found them to be uplifting," said Smith, who has lived in town since age 4 and is one of the women whose photo is etched in glass at the Pennsauken Transit Center on Derousse Ave. "They assigned me a writer. And when he saw the windows I designed at my church, they reached out to a production team to do a short film as well."

In Touch Ministries flew in three times from Atlanta to interview Dressler for the segment, titled "Masterpiece in the Making," talking about her life as an artist dealing with tragedy and loss. It also focuses on her work with students, as well as a landscape piece titled, "The Journey."

"I always begin my paintings with prayer," explained Smith, who is an adjunct faculty member at Camden County College and teaches at Arts Council of Princeton and in Philadelphia at the Pennsylvania Academy of the Fine Arts. "I believe that God gives me the ability to do what I do. That's where the ability comes from."

Dressler is still a little in shock about the opportunity she's received: to be able to share her artistic talents with a worldwide audience.

"I am so grateful. I hope the piece inspires others to do their art and make a living," said Smith. "It's just been a phenomenal experience that I couldn't think that would happen to me. To see my work shared across the world is incredible."

FOODADVENTURES "Unlunchables" An Alternative To The Popular Lunch Time Treat

I am currently enjoying my first time as a school parent. My son just started kindergarten in one of the Pennsauken elementary schools. We are both so excited at this new adventure. I've also found an opportunity in continuing a tradition, making my child's lunch like my mom used to make mine. I've discovered that there's so many fun things you can do in making lunch. I've dabbled with some ideas to try to mirror the beloved Lunchable food kit that has recently become quite hard to get my hands on. It seems like everybody has opted to go the way of the Lunchable, as it has always been a convenient and tasty snack for all school-age children.

My son is a big fan of ham and cheese

Lunchables, so I decided to make my own take on this to see what I come up with. For the ham and cheese, I got his favorite kind of cheese and lunchmeat – in this case, salami – and I created simple rollups. I then added a snack pack of club crackers. Any cracker your child likes will do. My son's lunch always includes one fruit and one vegetable. This is normally carrot sticks or grape tomatoes, and grapes. My son is a fan of coconut water, so I try to include Creative Roots coconut water for kids. It comes in a ton of different flavors and when it's available, it's worth trying.

Never hesitate to add a little extra treat, like a small piece of their favorite candy, and a special note each day for an extra special touch. I'm sure there will be people out there saying that they don't have time to hand make these lunches or go out and buy everything, but I assure you that the prep for these takes no time at all. I find that I can cut up carrot sticks while I'm watching my favorite show or even take the task of making the lunches as an opportunity to share with my child. This is only a template for what I normally include in my son's lunches. I think it all depends on the child. If your child isn't too fond of vegetables, I suggest finding cookie cutters or fun ways to cut those fruits and vegetables to make interesting shapes. I discovered a little hack with carrots where you can make them



Last year, dozens of Pennsauken families were helped through the Angel Tree program; the initiative for 2021 hopes to support the same number of families.



No physical contact is made with the child and no eye drops are administered. All information is kept confidential and is not sold nor shared with any other facility except the school nurse in a fashion that is HIPAA compliant. No child will be screened without parent/guardian consent and screeners do abide by the CDC requirements and distancing.

Pennsauken Township Police Officers Now Using Body Worn Cameras

that involves our officers. This data will be used for investigations, evidence, as well as training; and will serve to ensure the integrity and professionalism of the Pennsauken Police Department."

"For the past several years, Township Committee has made an ongoing commitment to support our first responders however possible," said Pennsauken Mayor Marco DiBattista. "Getting these body worn cameras into the hands of our officers will help them do their jobs that much better, providing a level of accountability that not only safeguards our men and women in uniform, but also helps build upon the trust our police have with the Pennsauken community."

There are several different mounting options for these body worn cameras. Depending where the officer is assigned and/or the uniform they wear, the cameras may be displayed on the officer in different locations.

Uniformed officers who wear outer vest carriers will have their body worn cameras affixed on either the upper left breast pocket of the outer vest carrier or affixed to the uppermost molle straps of the outer vest carrier, at center mass of their upper torso.


Uniformed officers not wearing an outer vest carrier will have their body worn cameras affixed to the buttoned placket on the officer's uniform shirt in the chest/sternum area at center mass.

Detectives assigned to the Investigative Unit, and other non-uniformed officers, will have the body worn cameras affixed to their belt on the waistline, at center, directly next to the buckle or affixed to their outer vest carrier at either of the two locations described.


