

## **County Making Roadway Improvements On Union Avenue**

On June 22, Camden County began a series of roadway improvements along Union Ave.

Running along Union from Park to Maple avenues, the scope of the project includes asphalt roadway milling and paving; installation of new stormwater inlets and piping to improve drainage; improvements to handicap ramps; traffic striping, signs, and raised pavement markers; and installation of concrete curbing, as well as the replacement of in-kind driveway aprons, as needed.

This roadwork will utilize lane shifts, so no closures are anticipated.

The estimated duration of the roadwork improvements is 150 calendar days from the start date, weather permitting.

## **WAGSWORLD** Catching The VW Bug With My First Beetle

I bought my first car this month, 54 years ago. I was home from a tour in Viet Nam, out of the Army for two whole days. I had 2,200 bucks saved up, and pictured myself in a Mustang, cruising the beach road in LBI. My good bud, El Carter, drove me up Maple Ave. to Rice and Holman after dinner. We spent the next two hours agonizing over all the offerings on display and in the used car line out back. The upshoot was I could have a '66 hardtop, 6-cylinder auto, cover the insurance, and be left with \$6.

I was heading for Camden County Community College in September. I pictured myself coasting through school, chasing girls, and having a few bucks in my jeans for drinking, without having a part time job. The Mustang, and not the hot one I desired, would change my plans.

Carter and I left Holman's at closing time, still undecided. Carter, and most of my other high school buds, drove VW Beetles. I had traveled with them when home, and at the end of my high school years, although I was always on two wheels.

As we backed out onto Maple Ave.

and turned down Union heading home. we saw a tan VW backing down the driveway right in front of us. The bug had a for sale sign in the windshield. The owner, a retired Army colonel, was bringing the car out front for good exposure. It was a 1961 Bug bought in Germany. It had little turn signals between the front door window and rear window. It was beige, low miles, and 600 bucks. I bought it after a ten-minute discussion. The owner left the tags and insurance on for a couple days, 'til I could get tags and title.

The bug was my own little hot rod, as I told my motor head friends. Everything a young man wanted: 4-speed, bucket seats, and dual exhaust. I was free to roam.

Two nights later, joining the family on vacation in LBI, I sat on the front steps, sipping on a cold beer, and watched my Uncle Al pull into the yard and dent my rear bumper. The distinguishing rear dent did make it easier to find in a full parking lot in the coming months.

College didn't work out real well. I had saved too much spending cash to avoid places that served beer. Six months later, I gave the VW to my dad, filled my duffel bag, and hitchhiked across America. He gave the bug to my sister, who used it for a few years, then sold it to a guy who made it into a dune buggy. To my best knowledge, it is still running in the pines out in Brick, N.J.

Since those days first home from the

Army, I have had way too many cars. I got that Mustang four or five times. I've had sports cars, hot rods, fishing and hunting wagons, and any number of trucks. I even tried replacing the VW, but the cars never made me feel as free, young, and wild as that first little beetle.

This July, I believe I will look for just one last car to recapture that feeling. What are the chances?

These violent storms seem to occur more regularly and there is a need to help Pennsauken residents understand how Public Works is allowed to assist in clean-up efforts during and following a storm. In any event, if your property sustains damage (house, car, shed, etc.) as a result of a storm uprooting a

tree, regardless of who owns the tree, you should contact your homeowner's insurance company and file a claim. During each storm, we provide an unfortunate education to residents who believe that the downed-tree owner is responsible for its clean-up and repair.

Here's how the Pennsauken Department of Public Works helps during this

#### Yard Debris Collection On Wednesdays

We ask that residents with only a fallen branch or two to clean up utilize the normal yard debris collection. This helps our staff focus on the large debris piles and lets South Jersey Sanitation handle some of the work during their contractual obligations. As a reminder, branches/twigs that can be cut or snapped into smaller pieces can be placed in a trash can (not recycling bucket) for Wednesday collection. No need to bundle if you only have a small amount. Bundling may take more time if you have a larger amount of debris, but you can be sure that it will be gone by Wednesday with this regularly scheduled collection.

## **Dragging Downed Branches For** Curbside Pick Up

A majority of cases with minor storm

debris will leave downed trees/branches that do not cause damage to properties but leave behind a significant amount of tree/brush debris that the average homeowner cannot "bundle and tie" per our Wednesday yard debris collection guidelines. In these instances, homeowners performing this cleanup within a couple days of the storm can drag the debris to the curb and contact the Department of Public Works office to be placed on the storm clean-up list. Depending on the severity and quantity of these calls, we will use the following weeks to collect from the street. This service will always occur after all streets and Township properties are cleared. We forgo some of our normal responsibilities to assign grass cutters to help residents in these instances. My economics classes call this an "opportunity cost," where we must give up one thing to get another thing we previously did not have. In this case, it's a service we do not perform daily and allocate manpower to the greater need. Thank goodness these storms only come a few times a year!

Here's some scenarios that occur during these times for future reference:

If a tree is blocking the roadway and no power wires are down, Public Works tree crews will clear the street. We are typically notified by County Dispatch, resulting from a call from residents after an

officer responds to the scene and reports back. This occurs 24/7 and we will respond to ensure the road is passable to emergency responders. The only exception to this is for trees that fall on state highways.

If a tree is blocking the roadway and power wires are down or within 15 feet of the tree, Public Works cannot safely cut and remove the tree. Due to the extreme electrical shock/electrocution hazard that is potentially present, our staff is not permitted to perform this work. In these instances, the police notify PSE&G to respond, along with their contracted and trained tree crew to cut up the tree with PSE&G staff on site to ensure electrical safety. This can take time, sometimes



The Pennsauken Sewerage Authority is responsible for the operation and maintenance of the sanitary sewage collection system in our service area. The sanitary sewage collection system is made up of main lines, force mains and pumping stations.


The homeowner owns and therefore is responsible for the operation and maintenance of the lateral line from their dwelling up to and including the connection to the main line.

The rules and regulations of the Pennsauken Sewerage Authority require a

back flow prevention device commonly referred to as a "back check valve" be installed whenever plumbing fixtures are located below street level, such as in the basement. PSA strongly recommends all our customers have a back check valve installed to prevent contamination in the event of a main line stoppage.

The discharge of water collected in a sump pit to the sanitary sewage collection system is prohibited.

Cooking grease poured down the drain can cause a blockage of the lateral line. Please dispose of grease properly.

Traps are available by appointment only, Tuesdays and Thursdays, from 1:00 to 5:00 p.m., at the Township Municipal Building, 5605 N. Crescent Blvd. During the appointment, residents will receive instruction on

the proper use and deployment of the trap. Individuals must provide proof of residency in the form of a valid photo ID, as well as a recent household bill.

Participants are responsible for maintaining and operating the trap; humanely capturing community cats on their property; securing appointments for the cats they trap to be spayed/neutered; and be-



## **MPWC Water Service Line Inventory Continues**

The MPWC sincerely appreciates our customers' response to our request for assistance in identifying customer owned portions of the water lines in our service area.

If you are not already aware, New Jersey Assembly Bill 5343 requires all water systems to inventory and replace lead service lines. The majority of our service lines are copper. However, we are required to provide an accurate inventory of the various service line types on the customer owned portion of the service for our entire service area.

YOU CAN HELP by informing us of the type of water line coming into your property. If you know what kind of pipes you have (copper, plastic, galvanized steel, lead, etc.) you can call our office and report the information to one of our Customer Support Representatives. You can also visit our website at www.mpwc.com for valuable information and pictures to assist you

with identifying your water service line and service line type.

If you are unsure, you may schedule an appointment with a Service Technician, or you can snap a photo of the pipe coming into the property that connects to your water meter.







days, depending on the extent of outages and PSE&G's availability. It's an unpleasant bit of news to have to deliver to residents, but no life is worth endangering when the proper procedures can perform the work safely. Sometimes, PSE&G will cut the tree, restore power, and leave behind the tree debris. As this sometimes occurs on nights or weekends, they usually do not inform us of the

debris left behind and residents get upset with Public Works. We ask for affected residents to notify our office and we will respond appropriately.

If a tree has fallen on your property, regardless of downed wires or not, Public Works tree crews will not remove the tree from your home. This is regardless of where the tree originated from; you would need to contact your insurance carrier/tree contractor to remove the tree. If you have someone cut up the tree and get it to the curb, Pennsauken Department of Public Works can make collection of the debris at that point.

## **Spectacular Succulents In The Summertime**

Happy summer! I hope you took advantage of some of the milder days we had in June and caught up on some lastminute gardening. I wound up buying an extra flat of vinca, which are well watered and doing quite nicely in the front garden.

I have added something relatively new to the "Rose gardens:" succulents. These hardy plants do extremely well in the summer, as they have thickened stems and/or leaves that do a great job retaining water in hot conditions. Cacti are succulents, but they're not the only one. Ice plants/carpet weeds, echeveria, aloe plants, shark tooth, donkey's tail, and string of hearts/pearls are other popular types.

While succulents are perfect for full sun, if you're introducing newly purchased plants, it's best to get them acclimated. Pots should be placed in areas where there is a mix of shade and sun for a few days until you make the move. If planting in the ground, it's a good idea to do so on a cloudy, overcast day, or even at night, when temperatures are lower. That being said, it can be dicey planting anything new outside this time of year.

Watering succulents is different than your other plants. You shouldn't water them too often. Check the top of the soil; if it's completely dry, give it a good soak, then give the soil time to drain out/dry. A

every two weeks or so.

water your flowers and other plants in the morning before full sun, and/or in the evening, beginning at dusk. If you have vegetables in your garden, they're just about ready to pick! Tomatoes will be ready soon. If they start to redden, pick them from the plants and put them by your windowsill indoors to finish ripening. Better that you enjoy them than the squirrels! Peppers, sweet corn, and eggplant should also be ready sometime this month.

When watering or weeding in your gardens, please be careful in the heat. After all, you're not a succulent! Put on sunscreen to protect your skin from getting sunburn. Wearing a hat will help your head and face. And make sure to protect your neck too; getting sunburn there is not fun! Also, remember to rehydrate while you are working or enjoying the outdoors.


