I admit it. I am an environmentalist:

a conservationist; a nature-loving, litter-hating, friend of the planet.

In fact, in some Township Committee meetings, I am jokingly (mostly) referred to as, "The Green Lady." As your mayor, I hereby resolve to correct that name. I am "A" Green Ladv. There are many of us out there and the numbers are growing. Because of that - we are growing greener. I truly believe that, as heads of households, women are the key to a greener Pennsauken. It's tough work, but green ladies are tough too.

Women are the first educators of children. We are the ones who teach about

trash, who insist on trash cans as the only place our food wrappers belong. It's a proven fact that "littering starts early," but good trashing habits do too. Moms, aunts, sisters, and grandmothers, we need to teach the young'uns, so we don't have to harass the 10-year-old kids when they are putting plastic bags in the recycling can; when they're not washing out the aluminum cans; when they're running the water for an hour; or, yes, when they litter. Try my recipe for weed killer and do your part to beautify your property, and Pennsauken, while saving the fish and loving the planet.

Homemade Weed Killer

- 1 Gallon White Vinegar
- 2 Cups Epsom Salt

• 1/4 Cup Dawn Dish Soap (original)

Put in a sprayer and mix. Wait for the dew to evaporate and spray. Don't hit the flowers. It's great for weeds in sidewalk cracks and along your curb/street line.

In a larger context, the Township is actively greening. We will soon be transforming the Delaware Gardens Park at River Rd. and 49th Street, removing invasive species of plants (weeds) and creating a trail to Tippin's Pond. We will also be entering the design phase of a project to clean up the abandoned rail bed along Chestnut Ave., between 36th Street and 43rd Street, and create a trail for active recreation that will connect with the Merchantville Mile. Both projects are grant funded and just two ways we are working to create a greener, healthier future for our families.

PSE&G Warns About Ongoing Phone Scams

PSE&G wants to alert New Jersey residents and businesses that scammers have spoofed one of the company's phone numbers in attempt to obtain personal information from customers. The utility has been receiving inquiries from customers returning calls they received from a PSE&G phone number that appeared on their caller I.D.

In light of this recent activity, if you receive an unexpected call from PSE&G in the coming days, you should hang up as it may be a scammer. If you have

pending business with PSE&G, such as an appointment or payment notice, call them back on the number provided on your bill, or call their customer service line, 800-436-PSEG (7734).

When a scammer pretends to work for PSE&G, they will often request personal data, such as credit card information or account passwords. Never provide this type of personal information. When a customer calls PSE&G to conduct account business, PSE&G has numerous secure methods for verifying

customer information.

Callers have recently reported that scammers have asked for personal information to obtain a meter reading, provide discounts on your PSE&G bill, or verify debit and credit cards on file. Such tactics are known utility scams, the most popular of which is a demand for immediate payment to avoid service termination. Before terminating service, PSE&G alerts customers in a number of ways: messages on their bill, letters and phone calls. PSE&G would never demand a specific type of payment nor threaten immediate service termination. While there are many ways to pay a PSE&G bill, the utility only accepts credit card and prepaid card payments through Western Union Speedpay, which charges a \$3.95 processing fee.

Parents must use the eve care specialist approved by the Lions.

So far this year, the Lions have collected 900 pairs of glasses through their white mailbox at the entrance of the Pennsauken Township Municipal Complex, 5605 N. Crescent Blvd. Sadly, they have also collected some mail that people accidently deposited into the box. The mail was eventually delivered to the Post Office, but the Club wants everyone to know that the box is not checked weekly, or even monthly, so time sensitive mail placed in that box will most likely not meet the deadline. Please do not use this box for regular mail or trash! It is for eye glasses only. Donated glasses do not need to be in a case, because the company that refurbishes the glasses only wants the frames and lenses. No sunglasses or cases,





School District Upgrades Meal Systems For Students, Staff, And Parents

Temporary Certificates Of Occupancy And The "As Is" Property Sale Program

We talked about the changes to the "AS IS" property sale program in last month's article. If you have ever participated in an "AS IS" sale, you may recall that often, due to the condition of the properties, it was necessary to obtain a Temporary Certificate of Occupancy (TCO). This certificate gave the responsible party an extension on the original compliance date for correcting the violations on the inspection report. Since the original program was only used for bank- and government-owned properties or estates with no living relatives, the potential for greater deterioration and

decay made the TCO program more necessary.

The TCO program gives a 90-day extension on the original compliance date for the correction of all of the violations noted on the initial inspection report. Because we have removed the restriction on the "AS IS" program, it would be safe to say that the amount of TCOs being requested is going to grow. That being said, we have made a few changes.

In an effort to control the number of extensions given on an inspection report, we are requiring a progress inspection to be completed between extension requests

If you are participating in an "AS IS"

transaction, the buyer must first obtain a copy of the inspection report and review the results, to ensure that they have a full understanding of what they will be taking responsibility for. They will then fill out and have notarized an affidavit, located in the Township's Construction Office, stating that they are taking full responsibility for all of the violations notated on the report. Upon completion, they will receive their first TCO.

If a second extension is required, you would need to schedule a "progress inspection." This step is one of the new requirements. In researching our current program, we found that we have properties that have far exceeded the nine-

month time frame of the initial inspection report, potentially making the initial report obsolete. In an effort to reduce the number of extensions given on an inspection report, we have put in place a "progress inspection." This inspection will give us a good idea on how much progress has been made since the first TCO was issued and how much time you may need to receive your final Certificate of Occupancy. Upon review, the extension will be granted, as long as significant work has not been completed.

A couple of additional notes: if the initial inspection report reaches the nine-month expiration date and there are no extenuating circumstances, the

responsible party will need to have a new housing inspection completed and pay the required fees. In addition, no TCOs will be granted for rental properties. Given the nature of these properties the TCO process is counterproductive to that purpose.

As we have said before, with each change comes adjustments. It's important that we clearly communicate all of the changes we are making, like the ones made to the "AS IS" program. We believe, based on our discussions with our concerned citizens, contractors, and investors, that the changes we have made to this program are important and necessary.



The Pennsauken Sewerage Authority is responsible for the operation and maintenance of the sanitary sewage collection system in our service area. The sanitary sewage collection system is made up of main lines, force mains and pumping stations.

The homeowner owns and therefore is responsible for the operation and maintenance of the lateral line from their dwelling up to and including the connection to the main line.

The rules and regulations of the Pennsauken Sewerage Authority require a back

flow prevention device commonly referred to as a "back check valve" be installed whenever plumbing fixtures are located below street level, such as in the basement. PSA strongly recommends all our customers have a back check valve installed to prevent contamination in the event of a main line stoppage.

The discharge of water collected in a sump pit to the sanitary sewage collection system is prohibited.

Cooking grease poured down the drain can cause a blockage of the lateral line. Please dispose of grease properly.



MPWC To Begin Flushing Of Fire Hydrants

The Merchantville-Pennsauken Water Commission's fall flushing program will take place Sunday through Thursday nights, beginning Sept. 15 through Sept. 26, between the hours of 7:00 and 11:00 p.m.

Hydrant flushing is an important element in our continuous efforts to improve the quality of water in our system. This procedure clears the distribution system of non-harmful sediment that may build up over time, as well as to help us ensure that each hydrant is operating properly for firefighting purposes. The MPWC schedules hydrant flushing during night hours to create the least impact on our customers.

While we are flushing in your neighborhood, you may experience

decreased water pressure and/or temporary discoloration of your water. While discoloration can be startling to see, rest assured, it poses no health or safety issues, as the cause of the discoloration is non-harmful iron and manganese mineral.

The MPWC will be posting flushing routes on our Facebook page throughout the duration of the fall program. If you see your street or a nearby cross-street listed on our Facebook page, we recommend not running your water between flushing times as the best course of action to prevent an accidental draw of discolored water into your home or business system. If discoloration does occur, we advise you to simply run your cold water for a few min-



utes until it is clear. The MPWC encourages you to check for discolored water before doing laundry.

The MPWC has been working

diligently to notify all of our neighbors and customers of when we'll be in specific areas during the hydrant flushing period. For the most up-to-date information, please "like" us on Facebook. We will post an updated list every day!

GOINGGREEN A Perfect Time Of Year To "Fall" Into Gardening

Temperatures are cooling, the mosquito invasion of this summer is finally in decline, and the angle of the sun is lowering as days shorten. If you recently purchased your first home, or are a beginner with gardening, now is the perfect time to try your hand in the garden. Autumn is a good time for planting, transplanting, and pruning your landscape.

The first step is to put on long pants, shirts with long sleeves, and a wide brimmed hat to protect your skin from the sun. Even though temperatures are in decline, the sun is still strong enough to cause skin damage. Now that you are dressed appropriately, grab a tablet electronic or old fashioned paper - and evaluate your current space.

Step back and look at your home and garden from the street. What do you see in the big picture? What's your curb appeal? Does the vignette make you happy? Do you have a large tree or shrub acting as a focal point to draw the eye across your space?

On the other hand, are the trees and shrubs so overgrown that your home can hardly be seen from the street? Does your grass grow green, or is it overrun with weeds and bare patches? Did some plants become diseased from all the rain we had this summer?

Do any of the trees, shrubs, or perennials have a fuzzy white substance on them? This could be a sign of powdery mildew, or worse, scale insects, which if left unchecked, can kill your plants.

Take notes as you walk your property, whether it has palatial acreage, or is a small space bounded by cement.

Once these questions have been answered and your evaluation is complete. don't become overwhelmed with all the work that needs to be done to turn your home into a showplace. Develop a list of everything that could to be done in a perfect world. Then, prioritize the list based on your desires, your time, and vour budget.

A good place to start is pruning. If vour landscape has become very overgrown, you don't necessarily need to rip everything out and start over. Judicious pruning can open up the space, while retaining the homey look of a mature landscape. There are a few important things to keep in mind while pruning large plants, like trees and shrubs. First, if trees or shrubs are dead, diseased, or dying, remove them as soon as possible, especially if they are very tall. Our area has been experiencing thunderstorms accompanied by high winds, which can rip out dead or dying trees, possibly landing on cars or homes. The next step is pruning overgrown trees and shrubs. Don't prune more than 20 percent of a plant in a single growing season. Pruning more can weaken the plant significantly, even kill it. Also, don't feed trees or shrubs until spring. Feeding now can encourage a new flush of growth that won't have time to mature and harden before frost kills it, again weakening the plant.

Once pruning has been finished for this season, step back and reevaluate your property, as the look of your growing space will have changed. More sun will be able to reach areas that may have been in complete shade before. If large spaces have been opened up by tree and shrub removal, is there now space for new things? Determine how much sun is available in those new spaces, research what plants can grow there, and take your list to neighborhood nurseries to

shop for replacements. Take advantage of late season clearance sales to add new garden accents that will grow and improve your space next spring.

Landscape design isn't that scary if you take it a step at a time, working on your list as time permits. Have fun, and most of all, plant what makes you happy!

A Brief Explanation Of Animal Control In Pennsauken

For many, many years, Pennsauken Township has had an animal control officer. But many people wonder, "What does animal control do in town?" Hopefully, this article helps to answer that question.

Animal control is not just taking care of animals, but also the people who own, lose, or find them. We enforce local and state laws concerning the care and treatment of animals, both domestic pets and wildlife. Animal control officers patrol public areas looking for potential signs of distressed animals and work directly with residents concerning animal issues. We are dedicated to educating the public about the safety and care of animals and work to maintain public health standards, keeping the community safe for both people and animals.

Sometimes, animal control officers

must capture or rescue animals; but other times we administer warnings or citations to residents suspected of animal cruelty and other violations, such as a dog running at large (not being in a fenced area or being off leash in the neighborhood), not being licensed in the Township, excessive barking, and other violations. You can check the Pennsauken Township website, twp.pennsauken.nj.us and select the "Code Book" button for a list of local

Animal control responds to calls from residents about stray animals, suspected animal cruelty, and deceased or sick/injured strays and wildlife. For immediate emergency situations, such as a stray dog running in the neighborhood, you can call the police. The police can get there quickly and they will make sure everyone, stays safe until animal control can get there.

If you believe an animal is in danger

and you suspect it may be a case of animal cruelty, please do not hesitate to contact Pennsauken Township's animal control at (856) 663-3058. We are very discreet and will not divulge who contacted us about the situation; but we will need your phone number in case we have questions. Animal control will conduct a welfare check to make sure the animal is safe. Again, if you believe there is an urgent situation, and the animal or a person is in immediate danger, you can call the police. They will manage the situation until animal control arrives.

Animal Control also picks up sick and injured wildlife. We cannot remove squirrels, birds, raccoons, or other wildlife from walls, attics, or basements. This should be handled by a wildlife control company. The cute little critters who may invade your yard such as groundhogs, skunks, and moles must also be taken care of by a wildlife control company. Some pest control companies also trap nuisance wildlife. These are services the homeowner must pay for on their own.

PUBLEC WORKS

Before I get to the main topic of this article, I'd like to welcome Luis Green and Greg Hannah to the Public Works team. Both residents of Pennsauken come to us with landscaping and handyman experience, as well as a lot of energy, adding pieces to the puzzle that is the future of our department. Lou and Greg began back in early June and have blended into our operations so seamlessly, I forgot to mention them in the July

and August editions of this article! They are quickly becoming assets to our organization and I look forward to continue working with them.

For those of you who have followed my exciting coverage on recycling the past few months, hold on to your seats! According to a letter from our recycling center, FCR Camden, LLC, any Pennsauken recycling trucks with over 8 percent contamination will be rejected. Contamination is when residents place non-recyclables in the recycling such as pizza boxes, plastic bags, Styrofoam, bubble wrap, frozen food containers, plastic/

paper to-go containers, cups, straws or utensils and even hoses or hangers. These items should always go in the trash. Remember: When in doubt, throw it out!

So what happens when one of our trucks has more than 8 percent contamination in its recyclables? According to the letter, Pennsauken will have to dispatch trucks to pick up the material and remove it from their facility within two hours. This will be a huge burden on Public Works operations and add significant cost to our disposal budget – even if 91 percent of that truck contains good recvclables! As I write this on Aug. 9, we have received two rejection notices: one truck from Monday's route and one from Tuesday's route. Although this applies to all Camden County municipalities, we need to evaluate and identify potential rejected load sources in Pennsauken.

Unfortunately, a one-week, heads-up letter was not enough time for an entire town to be evaluated, educated, and fixed before the effective date. It is also unrealistic for Public Works to look in each recycling bucket every single day. So to start, we will learn from the rejected recycling trucks, identifying which particular area of that collection day's route was over the 8 percent allowance. This will get us some rough data, but it's a starting point.

The two daily recycling trucks empty

their load once a day at the recycling facility, so coordination with our waste collection contractor, South Jersey Sanitation, will be critical to know what rejected load came from which area. This can be determined by using their truck's GPS system to see where the truck was in Pennsauken when it collected the contaminated recycling. This will not affect their daily collection.

Pennsauken residents produce a generally clean recycling stream. We have been informed on three or four occasions over the past year of a potential to reject. This makes the whole process easier for all parties and allows us to "clean up" just a few spots and educate across the board.

So after the areas with rejected loads are known, how can Pennsauken residents help prevent contaminated recycling from being collected? The recycling facility tells us which trucks are rejected. We take that truck's GPS and see what streets that recycle load came from. We will direct Pennsauken's Sanitation Inspector to this area on that street's next collection day to seek out any obvious contaminations. He will place a red "DO NOT COLLECT" tag on the recycling buckets with noticeable contamination and leave a friendly form letter posted on the front door that would indicate what the issue is how to correct it, and have a colored informational flyer attached. The correction 100 percent of the time will be to take the garbage item(s) out of the recycling and toss in the trash. On the following recycling collection day, the resident will place the recycle bucket at the curb and it will be collected. At this point, we believe the resident will know

Cholesterol: The Good, The Bad, And The Healthy

Cholesterol is a type of fat found in your blood. Your liver makes cholesterol for your body. You also can find it in the foods you eat. Meat, fish, eggs, butter, cheese, and milk all have cholesterol

Cholesterol is in every cell in your body. You need cholesterol to help your brain, skin, and other organs do their jobs. But too much can cause you harm. High cholesterol occurs when levels of cholesterol are too high, due to fatty deposits that start to build up in your blood vessels and arteries, restricting blood flow. Kind of like when your bathroom sink gets clogged. High cholesterol can be hereditary, or as a result of unhealthy diet and lifestyle choices. It can increase the risk of a heart attack.

There are two important types of cholesterol. LDL (low-density lipoprotein) cholesterol, or "bad cholesterol," carries cholesterol from the liver into the bloodstream, where it can stick to the blood vessels. There's also HDL (high-density lipoprotein) cholesterol, or "good cholesterol," which carries the cholesterol in the blood back to the liver, where it is broken down.

"H" for healthy.

How To Prevent High Cholesterol

• Eat as "clean" as possible, meaning

Camden County Hosts Commemoration Of Vietnam War

This month, the Camden County Freeholder Board and Office of Veterans affairs will host a four-day commemorative event in recognition of the 50th anniversary of the Vietnam War. The event will feature a different program each day, beginning Thursday, Sept. 5, and ending Sunday, Sept. 8.

On Thursday, Sept. 5, the Office of Veterans Affairs will host a special Vietnam Veteran Pinning and Medal Ceremony at 6:30 p.m. The ceremony will honor and celebrate veterans of the Vietnam War who are current members of our community.

On Friday, Sept. 6, veterans, their families, and other members of the community will come together for a candlelight remembrance vigil at the Traveling Tribute Wall in Cooper River Park to honor those Vietnam veterans who never returned home.

On Saturday, Sept. 7, the County will host a veterans resource fair, featuring family fun, educational activities, and a concert featuring the Tri-County Symphonic Band and Gary Puckett and the Union Gap.

The commemoration will conclude on Sunday, Sept. 9, with a closing ceremony and the 9/11 Heroes Run.

The program is hosted by the Board

of Freeholders in partnership with the Vietnam War 50th Anniversary Commemoration, the Philadelphia VA Medical Clinic, and The Travis Manion Foundation; it commemorates the 50th anniversary of the war which began in November 1955 and ended in April 1975. In 2012, President Barack Obama issued a proclamation to recognize the 50th anniversary of the war over a 13-

year period, during which the federal government would work with local governments to honor and celebrate the veterans in their communities.

Portions Of River Road, Union Avenue Closed For Water Main Replacement

Freeholder Susan Shin Angulo, liaison to the Camden County Department of Public Works, has been notified by the Merchantville Pennsauken Water Commission that crews are replacing a water main on River Rd. and Union Ave. in Pennsauken. Work began in August; during this time, stretches of both River Rd. and Union Ave. will be closed during work hours.

"This project is expected to last several weeks and will require detours for motorists who typically drive through this area as part of their commute," Shin Angulo said. "It's important to be aware of the project in advance and plan ahead for any expected delays. Motorists can expect sudden stops, shifting traffic patterns, and other changing conditions in the area surrounding construction. Ad-

ditionally, you should be extra cautious and attentive when driving near construction crews and vehicles."

From the hours of 7:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. crews will completely close River Rd. between Lennox Rd. and Union Ave. Union Ave. will also close between River Rd. and Haines Rd. Motorists will be directed along a posted detour route to circumvent the affected roadway.

While construction is ongoing, the contractor will allow South Jersey Sanitation through the work area on Mondays to collect the trash and recycling of the homes that reside in that area.

The project is expected to be completed by the end of work hours on Friday, Nov. 13. Scheduling and project timing is dependent on weather and may be adjusted due to unforeseen events.




