MINUTES TOWNSHIP OF PENNSAUKEN TOWNSHIP COMMITTEE MEETING JANUARY 25, 2017 (5:30PM)

A Meeting of the Pennsauken Township Committee was held on Wednesday, January 25, 2017 in the meeting room at the Township of Pennsauken Municipal Building, 5605 N. Crescent Blvd. Pennsauken, NJ 08110.

After mechanical problems with the chairlift, Mayor McBride called the meeting to order at 5:36 pm, the roll was recorded as such:

PRESENT: Mayor Betsy McBride, Deputy Mayor Killion, Committeeman Taylor, Committeeman Figueroa and Committeeman Orth

Also present were Township Administrator John Kneib, Township Clerk, Gene Padalino, Deputy Clerk Pamela Scott-Forman and Township Attorney Michael Joyce.

Roll call was followed by the Pledge to the Flag with a moment of silence.

Mayor McBride announced that the Meeting was being held in compliance with the "Senator Byron M. Baer Open Public Meetings Act".

Committeeman Figueroa moved a motion to approve the minutes on the agenda; which was seconded by Deputy Mayor Killion. An affirmative 5/0 voice vote was recorded for both Reorganization meeting of January 4, 2017 and January 18, 2017. An affirmative vote of 4/0/1 (Killion) was recorded for November 2, 2016.

SECOND READING-PUBLIC HEARING (PUBLIC MAY COMMENT)

ORDINANCE NO. 2017:02

AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF PENNSAUKEN AMENDING AND SUPPLEMENTING CHAPTER 299 OF THE CODE OF THE TOWNSHIP ENTITLED VEHICLES AND TRAFFIC BY ADDING A NEW ARTICLE III, ENTITLED "DON'T BLOCK THE BOX"

WHEREAS, N.I.S.A. 39:4-8 and N.I.S.A. 39:4-197(1)(d) & (e) empowers the Township of Pennsauken ("Township") to take regulatory action to govern traffic within the Township; and

WHEREAS, the Township has determined that traffic at the intersection of 36th Street and Rudderow Avenue has been intensified by the blockage of said intersection resulted in safety concerns as well as restricting the expedition of traffic along the public highways; and

WHEREAS, the Township has determined that to prevent the blockage at the intersection of 36th Street and Rudderow Avenue, it is necessary to stripe the intersection to indicate a "box," to install signage instructing motorist not to block the "box", and to amend the Township Code to permit enforcement of an ordinance restricting this activity; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to <u>N.I.S.A.</u> 39:4-67, motorist are prohibited from obstructing traffic at intersections.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, by the Township Committee of the Township of Pennsauken in the County of Camden and State of New Jersey as follows:

Section 1. Part II, entitled General Legislation, Chapter 299, "Vehicles and Traffic" of the Code of the Township of Pennsauken is hereby supplemented and amended Article VI, "Special Zones and Areas," by adding Section 299-18, "Don't Block the Box" which shall read in its entirety as follows:

Section 299-18. Don't Block the Box.

No person shall stop or stand a vehicle upon any of the following marked intersections unless there is sufficient space on the other side of the intersection to accommodate the vehicle without obstructing the passage of other vehicles or pedestrians:

36th Street and Rudderow Avenue

Appropriate striping and signage shall be provided at these intersections. Enforcement of this Ordinance shall be by the Township of Pennsauken Police Department pursuant to N.I.S.A. 39:4-67. There shall be a penalty of \$54.00 of each violation of this Ordinance along with appropriate court costs.

<u>Section 2.</u> All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict or inconsistent with the provisions of this ordinance are, to the extent of such inconsistency, hereby repealed.

Section 3. In case, of any reason, any section or provision of this Ordinance shall be held to be unconstitutional or invalid, the same shall not affect any other section or provision of this Ordinance, except so far as the section or provision so declared unconstitutional or invalid shall be severed from the remainder or any portion thereof.

Section 4. This Ordinance shall take effect in accordance with law.

Administrator Kneib explained the purpose of the ordinance again, concerning the "Don't Block the Box" area at Rt. #130 & Cove Rd.

Mayor McBride asked for any comments from the public on Ordinance 2017:02, there were none.

Committeeman Orth moved the motion to adopt Ordinance 2017:02; which was seconded by Committeeman Taylor and recorded with a 5/0 roll call vote.

WHEREAS, the Government Accounting Standards Board (GASB) establishes financial accounting and reporting standards for state and local government entities, which recognize GASB as the official source of generally accepted accounting principles for state and local government; and

WHEREAS, GASB Standard No. 45 establishes the guidelines for accounting and financial reporting of other post-employment benefits (OPEB) and requires each public agency to engage biennially a certified actuary to calculate the current and future costs and liabilities of an agency's OPEB; and

WHEREAS, the Township of Pennsauken solicited Request for Qualifications (RFQ) to perform actuarial services related to GASB 45; and

WHEREAS, The Township of Pennsauken received five (5) submittals; and

WHEREAS, Summit Benefit Consultants, LLC, 115 N Church Street, Moorestown, NJ 08057 was deemed most qualified to perform the Actuarial Study:

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Township Committee of the Township of Pennsauken, in the County of Camden authorizes Summit Benefit Consultants, LLC in the Amount of \$5,400 to perform GASB 45 Actuarial Services for the Township of Pennsauken.

Administrator Kneib commented this was as a result of a recommendation by Bowman to check the liability for retiree's.

Mayor McBride asked if anyone form the public wished to comment, there was no one wishing to comment.
